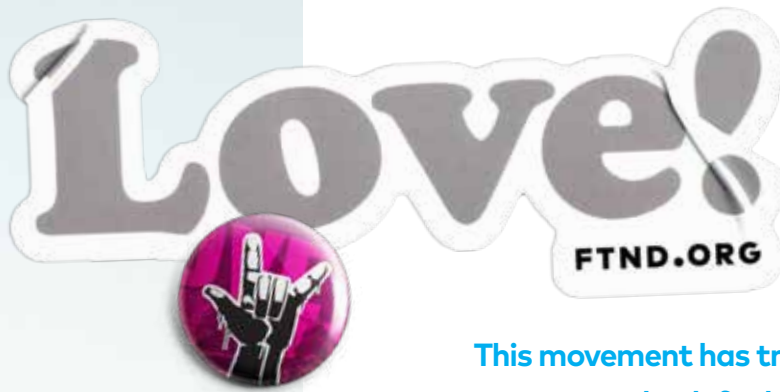




2017 → ANNUAL REPORT

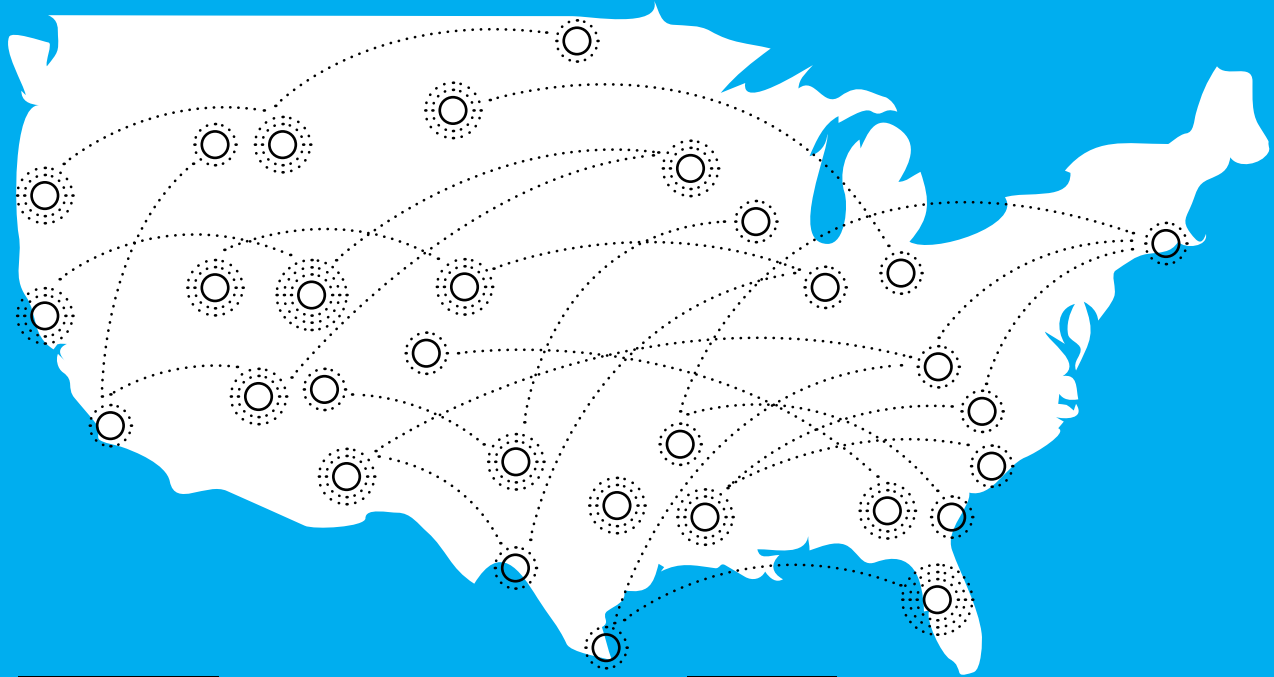

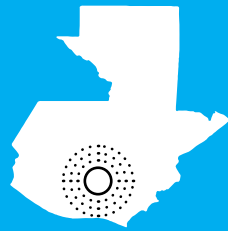

Become A Fighter

Fight the New Drug's live presentation program is one of the most powerful vehicles for this movement, bringing this message to communities across the world and empowering Fighters in their areas to get educated and fight for love.

We are continually inspired by meeting youth face-to-face and seeing not only how pornography impacts this generation, but also what these young people are doing to fight back. Our presentation tours took us to 7 different countries and 26 different U.S. states in 2017. As this program gains momentum internationally, we've begun working with passionate Fighters to provide them with the tools and resources necessary to begin training to present for FTND in their own countries. This is a huge step for the movement and shows just how far awareness and education about this issue are reaching, and it's so incredible to be part of this growth and globalization.

Presentation Program Structure

Since we started doing presentations a few years ago, the goal has always been to get this information to youth. Our ultimate aim is to help them, their parents, and other community members understand the harmful effects of pornography, and empower them to be advocates for change. As the Presentation Program continues to grow, we've recognized the need to revamp the structure of the program to make it more sustainable—and this year we accomplished that. Not only do we now have a structure that covers all presentation costs, but it also allows us to continue to certify contracted presenters across the globe to help spread this important message even further. ●

Website

As a main vehicle for this movement's message, we put a lot of resources into making sure that the website is constantly updated, and ready to receive millions of visitors from around the world.

We had a variety of website upgrades this year, including a revision and update of all of our Get the Facts articles, and an update to the design and feel of the FTND website to make it more consistent with our interactive fact site learn.ftnd.org. We worked to improve our search engine optimization by adding accelerated mobile page versions of all articles to help both mobile load times and search ranking. We also transitioned our entire site to an HTTPS connection, which also helps boost our search rankings. Earlier in 2017, we rebuilt the online store—both updating the design and making the entire experience more mobile-friendly to help Fighters find conversation-starting gear as easily as possible.

Blog

Our blog continues to be a strong leg of our mobilization program, with over 1,000 published pieces on our site that detail the various harms of porn and its effects on consumers, their relationships, and the world. In 2017, we made a massive push to create more comprehensive content that not only engages the information, but also dives deeper into empirical data. For example, we started a weekly series called, "What's the Research?" where we link Fighters to research studies that are already published, and connect them with the data. We also developed and expanded our team of contributing writers, having six writers from all over the world contributing pieces monthly at the pique of 2017.

Other updates to the FTND Blog included the addition of filters to make content more easily navigable, and to allow more sensitive readers the ability to exclude potentially triggering content. We also added content modals to blog posts in an effort to increase conversion rates, and these modals invite readers to get involved in the movement. Whether it be through sharing the post they're reading, grabbing a tee to help raise awareness, or signing the Fighter Pledge and becoming more connected—these modals are helping Fighters take active steps to help educate others on the harms of porn. We anticipate this medium to continue to be a valuable tool in communicating our message of awareness, love, and hope to our growing Fighter community. ●





Digital Marketing

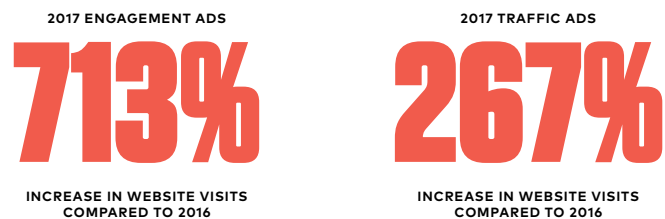
In Quarter 3 of 2017 we revamped our marketing strategy to fully optimize our paid and organic channels. This shift allowed us to increase our paid social (Facebook) purchases by 265%, our Facebook Page Likes by 117%, our paid search purchases by 32% (while reducing the cost per conversion by 68%), and our Instagram (organic) purchases by 177% compared to January–August.

Refining our overall strategy, being more strategic with our ad spend, and optimizing our organic platforms allowed us to grow the FTND store while bringing the movement to thousands of new Fighters. We are excited to continue to refine our strategy in 2018 and are working to reach more people than ever before while growing the store to be a consistent source of revenue. ●

Social Media

2017 was another vibrant year for Fight the New Drug's social media platforms and website. Our blog content continues to connect with and inspire Fighters around the world.

We had three blog posts each reach over one million people on Facebook this year. Our top-reaching post for 2017 was Mythbuster's Adam Savage talking to his sons about porn, which reached over 1.48 million people. Our top-performing, non-celebrity Instagram post for the year came during #NoPornovember. We featured a photo of an incredible #NoPornovember mural three Fighters painted on Krog Street in Atlanta, and that post reached over 63,000 people and received almost 10,000 likes! Our highest traffic month for the website was February, which brought in over 3.12 million sessions. We had over 8.26 million sessions from new users alone this year, which is an incredible step forward for us as we try to bring the fight for love to new people around the world. FTND's online presence is a force to be reckoned with, and we are eager to continue to grow our platforms, reach, and online reputation in 2018.

Social Media Fundraisers

In October of this year, Facebook approved FTND's request to become a registered non-profit on the platform. This approval was an incredible breakthrough because it allowed us to add a "donate" button directly to our Facebook page and start running fundraisers across Facebook all year. Fighters can now "donate their birthday" to FTND by creating fundraisers where friends and family donate to the cause to try and reach a personally-set fundraising goal on the Fighter's profile. Just in the last couple months, we've had 28 Fighters create Facebook fundraisers for FTND and they've raised \$2,350! We anticipate many more successful Fighter-initiated Facebook fundraising campaigns in the months to come. ●

Rep the Movement

Fighter gear continually gives individuals the opportunity to support and physically represent this movement to promote change.

By repping our movement-inspired gear, Fighters are actively representing what this cause is all about, all while sparking conversations with our head-turning designs. This year, we invested time and energy into making the FTND store as user-friendly as possible with a huge redesign. We also worked to achieve our goal to continually create new products that provide variety for

our diverse Fighters, and we exceeded our goal to release at least one new piece of Fighter gear per quarter. We are so proud of all the new gear we launched in 2017, and are constantly inspired by all of our Fighters who are repping the movement across the globe and making the movement recognizable in their communities!

Quarter One

We released the **"Love Takes Two"** tee in connection with our February Campaign, as well as a special Valentine's Day **"Live For Love"** tee which our Fighters were stoked about!

Quarter Two

Our boldest anti-trafficking **"#StopTheDemand"** tee was launched as part of our huge trafficking-awareness campaign in May, and we created our annual **"Fighter"** tank for our seasonal release.

Quarter Three

We released our first-ever **"Fighter"** hat, complete with the Fighter Pledge on the inside label. Also, for our back-to-school educational campaign, we released a brand new **"Rock The Basics"** kit in August. This specially-designed, exclusive kit is full of wristbands, buttons, bandannas, pass-along cards and more to help Fighters share the facts!

Quarter Four

With our most ambitious merch release at one time yet, we launched 8 new products in the final stretch of 2017.

- The first ever long-sleeve, retro-inspired **Limited Edition "Porn Kills Love"** tee.
- The return of our **Charcoal & Gold "Porn Kills Love"** tee in both men's & women's sizing.
- The brand new **"Fight The Status Quo"** tee which focuses on what it really means to be a Fighter.
- The bold conversation-starting **"Papa Kilo Lima"** tee which uses the International Phonetic Alphabet to spell "P.K.L."
- The pink **"For The Sake Of Love"** tee which uses the word "love" in 88 languages to emphasize the global aspects of this movement and what we're really fighting for.
- The cozy seasonal **"Lover & Fighter"** crew sweatshirt.
- The rad **"Fight For Love"** dad hat which uses the American Sign Language symbol for "I love you" to spread our pro-love message.
- The first ever **"Porn Is Totes Not Cool"** tote, which works to infuse humor to open the door into a topic that requires serious conversations.

Fighter App Campaigns

The Fighter App continues to be an exciting extension of our mobilization program, bringing the movement to Fighters all over the world with just the touch of a button on their smartphone.

Since its launch in November of 2016, the app has done exactly what we dreamed it would do, bringing together youth from diverse backgrounds and expanding the reach of this movement into Fighters' everyday lives and conversations. The app allows users to engage in relevant campaigns that give them tangible actions to participate in, that directly contribute to the movement. Fighters can now make a real, measurable difference just by donating their time.

In an incredible jump up from 2016, there were **170,670 minutes donated between 5 Fighter App Campaigns in 2017**. Notable accomplishments that gathered thousands of supporters and donated minutes are May's #StopTheDemand campaign, all focused on pornography's link to sex trafficking and sexual exploitation. As a grand prize, we partnered with HELP International for one Fighter to embark on a trip of a lifetime to Nepal to volunteer with sex trafficking survivors. And this #NoPornovember, 'A Global Fight For Love,' took a virtual journey around the world, exploring this issue and what a few inspiring individuals are doing to fight back in their communities across the globe. •

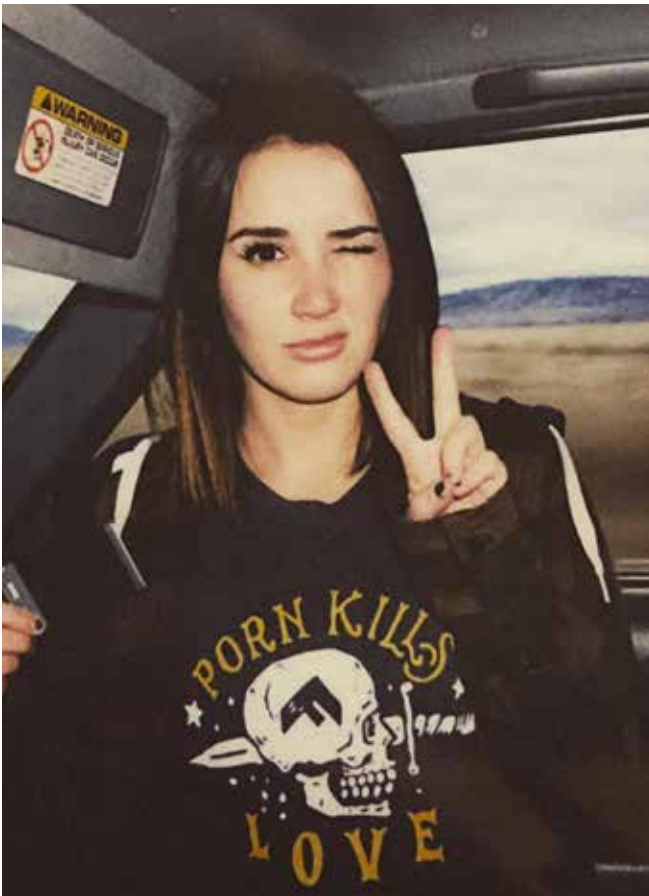

We were able to collaborate with many amazing Fighters, who shared their experiences with spreading the movement around the globe—including our 2017 Fighter of The Year, Daniel Broderick from Ireland, who went above and beyond this year to help others learn about the harmful effects of pornography. •



Fighter of the Year

NAME DANIEL

LOCATION DUBLIN, IRELAND

The 2017 Fighter of the Year embodies everything that it means to be a Fighter. From Dublin, Ireland, Daniel has been dedicating his time for the past few years to this movement for love by sharing his own personal story as well as spreading the facts whenever he can.

We first met Daniel when we noticed he posted an inspirational video on Facebook sharing why he is passionate about this movement, and we had to share it! But that video was only the beginning of the awareness Daniel would raise on this important issue.

In sharing his own story with others, Daniel says, "My journey against porn has been a long one. I watched porn pretty consistently since my teen years, mostly around exams, stress, or out of boredom. Nevertheless, I usually felt pretty out of touch with reality afterward and thought to myself, surely if I felt horribly lonely after porn, there must be others out there who felt the same."

He then decided he wanted to make a change and he signed up for Fortify, and went 200 days without porn!

"I'm still on my way towards freedom from pornography, something that I believe will not enrich or enhance your life in any way—and I'd encourage anyone else to try it. What do you have to lose?"

"It felt so freeing! I never thought I'd go without it for so long. It was the greatest confidence boost, I felt like I'd put it behind me," Daniel said. "Because porn festers and grows in the shadows, I thought, why not shine a light on it?" That's exactly what he did.

He started by posting videos like the one that initially caught our attention. Then, he wrote articles that highlighted the research on porn's harms, and worked to get them published in his university newspapers. But he didn't stop there, he wanted to do something bigger and bolder.

He decided to walk 500 miles, across France and the north of Spain, on a famous trail called the Camino de Santiago de Compostela, all while supporting this cause. Although the trail is not an easy one with temperatures dropping below freezing in the mountains and the path stretching into a desert in the north of Spain, Daniel persisted. He walked to encourage those who were fighting against porn alongside him, to raise funds for FTND, and also to encourage other porn-consumers to detox porn with him for 25 days, the exact number of days of the journey—and he did it all while sporting a 'Porn Kills Love' tee.

"The journey was, for me, much like my own recovery from porn," Daniel said. "The joy and sweat of reaching 200 days, the sadness of breaking such a long streak and relapsing, the encouragement and support from others, and of course the personal nature of it all. You walk your own pace, everyone arrives at different stages."

Over his journey, Daniel has said that his Porn Kills Love tee was one of the greatest conversation-starters. "I shared with anyone who spoke Spanish or English and the reactions were so positive. It's like everyone I talked to,

from a retired millionaire to a complete hippy agreed that porn was not a force for good, but a very strong force in our society," Daniel said.

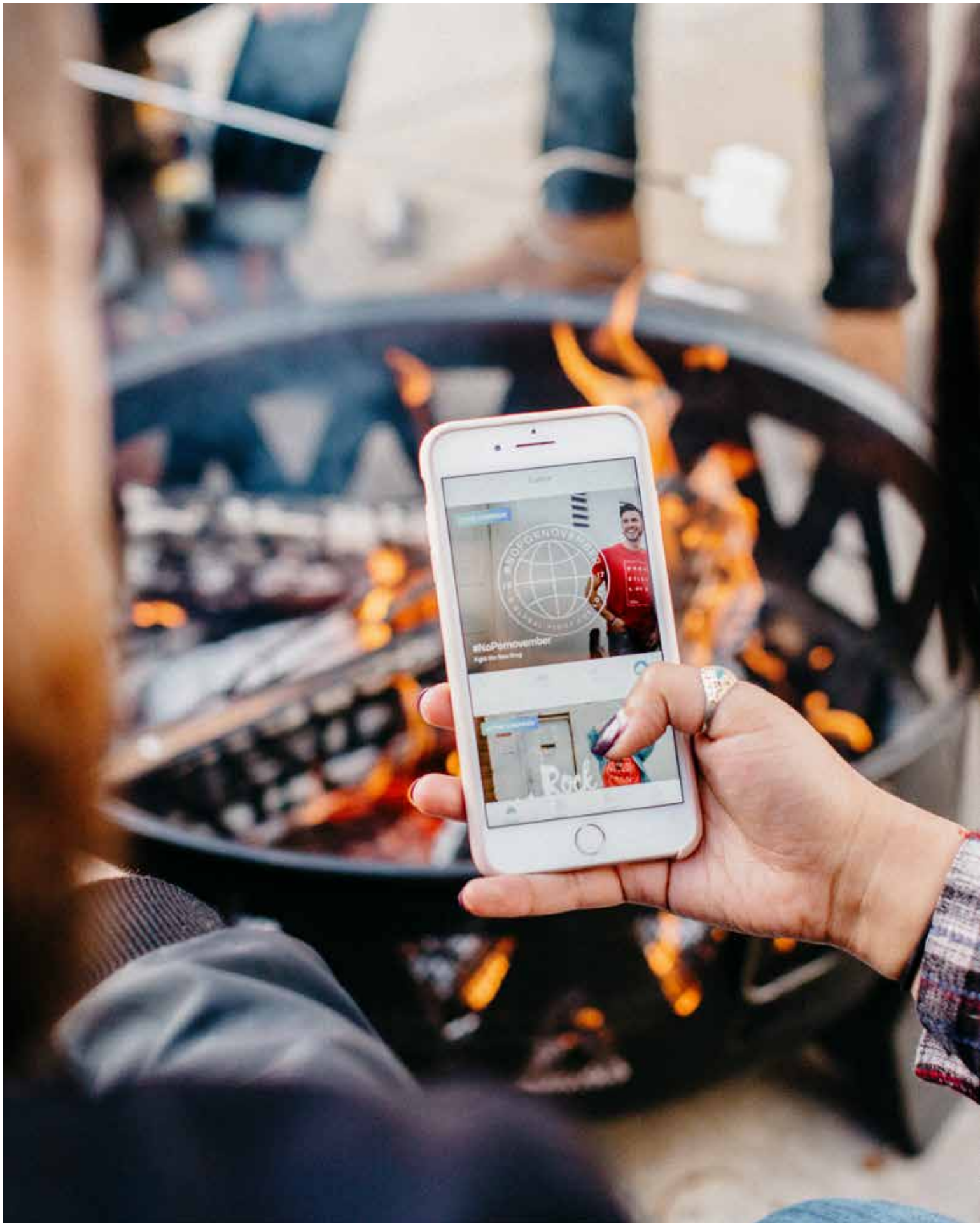
"It may sound incredibly cheesy but it's a great metaphor for anyone fighting against their own porn dependency. There's uphill and downhill, sometimes you'll stumble, there are heaps of blisters and adjustment-discomfort, you will be frustrated, you will get lost or go off the trail. You can also try to go it alone, do it all yourself. However, the journey is made lighter by relying on strength greater than your own, accepting encouragement, doing it with others, being honest, sharing the load. Let me guarantee you, the feeling of reaching Santiago or going 100 days without porn justifies the long process of reaching that point."

Daniel encourages anyone out there who might be struggling with porn to give freedom a try.

"I'm still on my way toward freedom from pornography, something that I believe will not enrich or enhance your life in any way—and I'd encourage anyone else to try it. What do you have to lose?"

We are so inspired by the effort Daniel has put into this cause thus far, and we know this is not the end of the road for his Fight. In fact, he is currently planning to start an organization that can continue to help raise awareness on this issue. We couldn't be more proud of our 2017 Fight of the Year!

Development & Fundraising

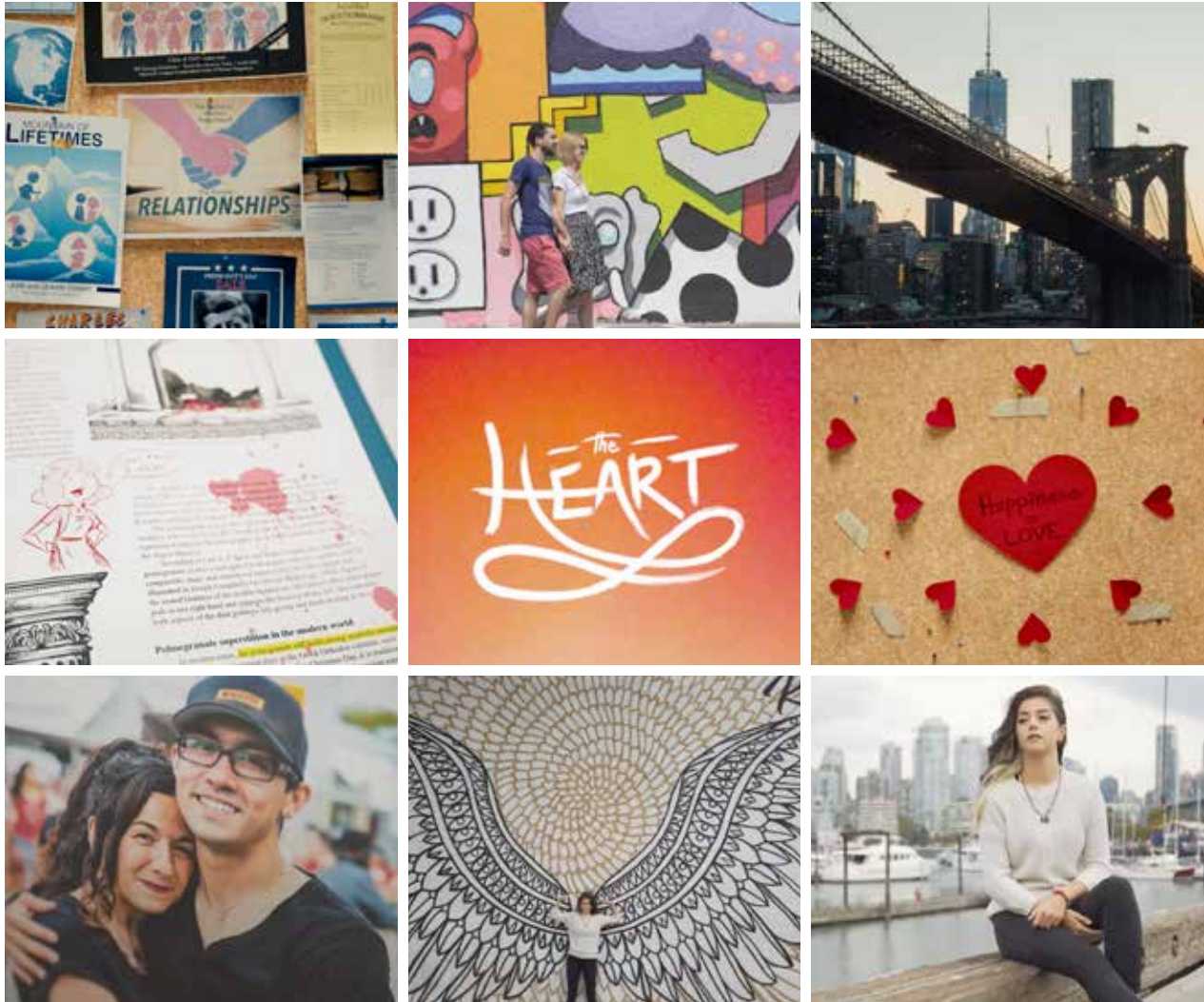
As an organization, we are beyond grateful for the continued financial support of those dedicated to the movement and for those who have donated in previous years and renewed their giving in 2017.

We are also grateful for and welcome those new to supporting Fight the New Drug. The additional support from these new benefactors has resulted in a 57% increase in our donor base.

State specific 501(c)(3) registration requirements have gone very well. Of the 37 states that require nonprofits to register, 32 states have approved Fight the New Drug to conduct development and fundraising activities

within their state. We anticipate the approval of the remaining 5 states to occur during the first quarter of 2018.

Moving forward we are excited and optimistic about our development and fundraising opportunities. In the coming year we look forward to establishing new relationships with individuals and organizations to join us our Fight for Love. ●

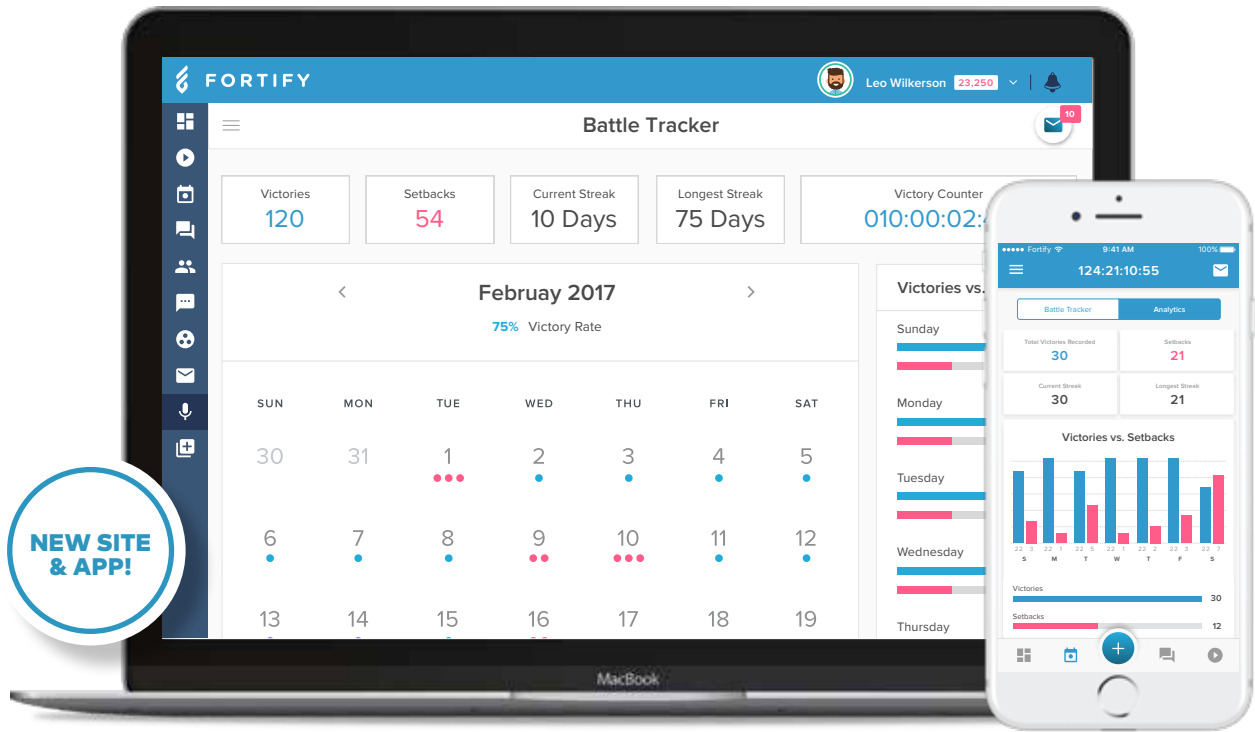


Documentary Episode Two: The Heart

In 2017, we made considerable progress on our 3 part documentary series, "The Brain, The Heart, The World." A rough cut of the first section of episode 2 was finished as part of our 2017 goals, and we are anticipating the rest of the film to follow shortly in the beginning months of 2018.

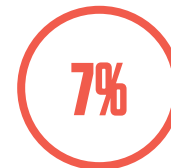

One of my residents saw my [FTND] shirt one day and immediately started to interrogate me. She almost seemed angry. I explained to her that I had been addicted to pornography for 10 years, but was now 10 years clean of my addiction. I shared with her about how my knowledge of the connections between porn and trafficking had been part of my motivation to quit. She quickly broke down in tears, sobbing in my arms saying, "I thought I was the only woman who struggled with porn!!! There are people out there who understand?!"

Turns out her addiction to porn—the isolation, loneliness, etc.—had been one of the bigger factors in making her vulnerable to being trafficked. She was then forced to make pornography and sell her body on the streets so her pimp could buy dope.

I've since introduced her to FTND and she is ON BOARD!

She's five months clean of pornography, she's passionate about spreading awareness and education about the science of porn addiction, she's seven months clean from drugs and eight months free from her trafficker. She's been validated and liberated by all you do and put out there. It's a part of her story she had never shared with anyone before. Now she's dealing with it in therapy and finding victory.

All because of a T-shirt!"

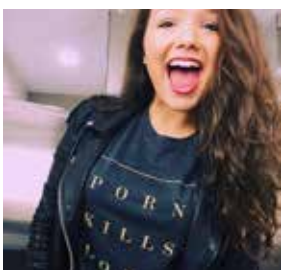


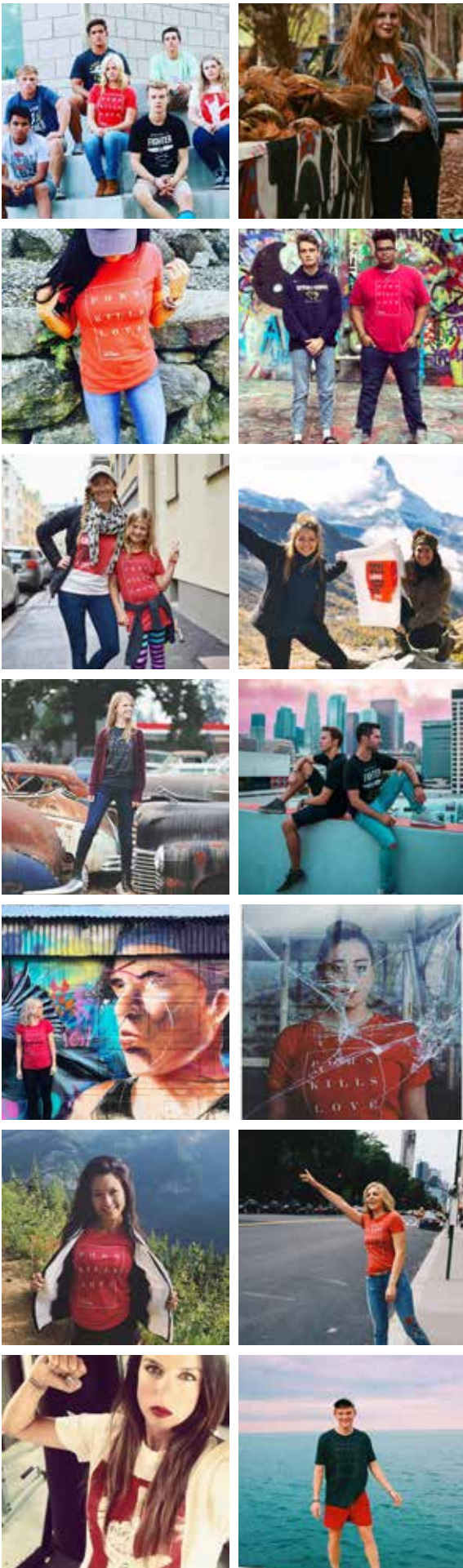
